

LOGAN'S FORT

RECONSTRUCTION BEGAN IN 2009 WITHIN JUST A FEW YARDS OF THE ORIGINAL FORT THAT WAS BUILT IN 1775 ON THE WILDERNESS ROAD. THE CITY OF STANFORD OWNS 16 ACRES AND A PLAN WAS DRAWN TO DEVELOP THE PARK.

ST. ASAPH SPRINGS/BUFFALO CREEK BENJAMIN LOGAN CHOSE THE FORT SITE BASED ON PROXIMITY TO THESE WATER SOURCES.





IN 2016, THE FRIENDS OF LOGAN'S FORT BEGAN PLANNING EVENTS AT THE FORT, RECONSTRUCTION HAS BEEN STEADY AND THE PARK PLAN IS BEING DEVELOPED SLOWLY.
